Dear Subscriber,

It's time to again consider a subscription to Franklin Rescue. This year's subscription fee has increased to **\$50.00** and ensures you will pay nothing more than this amount out of pocket for ambulance services. Here's how it works: if you have insurance we will bill your carrier and as a subscriber, any remaining balance will be written off; if you are not a subscriber, you will receive a bill for any balance remaining after your insurance has paid. If you are a subscriber and have no insurance, the entire balance is written off. The subscription fee covers members of your household and guests; it does not cover employees. With the ever-increasing cost of insurance, this remains the best deal around for our subscribers. If you've subscribed in the past, we urge you to do so again; if you have never subscribed, we are asking you to subscribe this year. Subscriptions made payable to Franklin Rescue can be mailed to P.O. Box 182, Franklin, VT 05457.

We would like to remind you that if you have an emergency, Dial "911". Franklin has, along with the other towns in Franklin County, moved its emergency services to St. Albans Central Dispatch. The person answering your call to "911" is trained to handle medical emergencies and will stay on the line to assist you. Complimentary glow-in-the-dark "911" labels are available for your telephone from Franklin Rescue. Non-emergency calls may be directed to 285-2050.

This year Franklin Rescue has begun distributing a quarterly newsletter entitled *The Pulse*. Complete with articles on safety, recognizing emergencies and health awareness, you will find something new and interesting each quarter. *The Pulse* can be found at the Town Clerk's Office, local merchants, the Franklin Rescue website, and by contacting the station directly.
