LCCA Annual Meeting

President Dick Lang has arranged to have Eric Hansen of the Vermont Loon Recovery Project (VLRP) as our guest speaker. He will present a slide program titled, "*Loon Conservation in Vermont....People Make the Difference.*" Hanson is a biologist working for the VLRP since 1998, and conducted loon research for many years. He has worked in Minnesota, Michigan and Wisconsin. For two years he worked capturing loons and banding them for identification purposes.



When not chasing loons or working with Vermont's several hundred loon volunteers, he teaches courses on animal tracking, winter predators,

hawks and owls and the literature of conservation.

Although we do not have a nesting pair of loons at Lake Carmi, the VLRP notes Lake Carmi has good potential for nesting loons. This year's loon population is very active and several loon watch volunteers are living at Lake Carmi, at least on a part time basis.

The annual meeting begins with a pot luck dinner. Bring a dish to share. 6:00 pm at the Franklin Town Hall, July 12.

In Case of Emergency

Ambulance and fire calls need the 911 address, the life you save may be yours.

The Franklin Fire and Rescue departments make new 911 number signs available at a very low cost. These green signs, with reflective white numbers, should be placed in a visible location to be seen by emergency personnel.

They can be mounted on a post or placed on the side of the cottage. The single sided sign to be attached to the camp cost \$15.00. The double sided sign, for use on the mailbox or other post, cost \$17.50.

To order send your check to: Franklin Fire/Rescue, P.O. Box 182, Franklin, VT 05457. Be sure to specify which sign you are ordering and the 911 address number to be printed. Please include your correct mailing address and telephone number.

The old camp number sign should be removed. it could endanger your family and friends.

Please inform your guests, family and friends that we have several loons on Lake Carmi. They are a protected species. Boats, canoes, jet skis, and other recreational devices should be no where near them. Do not disturb them or try to get close to them. They are great to watch and listen to, leave them alone and we might even get a nesting pair some year.


Lake Carmi Cottage and Garden Tour

LCCA Board of Directors Meet

The LCCA board met at vice president Helen Dever's cottage on June 21. They reviewed the activities of the past year and planned for the future.

Moe Poissant of the Dewing Shore was present to discuss the maintenance of the sea wall put in place two falls ago. Chris O'Shea of the Franklin Watershed Committee was present and able to review that project and plans to complete the sea wall for the remainder of the Dewing Road shoreline. It was noted the spring fishermen have done considerable damage to that section. Much work is needed to keep the wall in good condition.

Poissant also discussed the possibility of having an "end of summer" boat parade. This has been done in years past, he volunteered to serve on a committee along with Bob Rennie. Several volunteers are needed, please call either Poissant (285.6732) or Rennie (285.6519) to assist.

The LCCA water quality fund has nearly \$10,000 in it. This money is used to fund specific water quality enhancement projects in the Lake Carmi watershed. President Lang noted that there may be some opportunity to cost share with the Franklin Watershed Committee projects in the near future.

Treasurer Wendell Fortier's report noted that there is some \$12,009 in the Century Club. Longtime director Dick Davis explained the Century Club for the newer members. It seems that some 64 members each contributed \$100 to this fund to help provide matching funds (along with the Town of Franklin) for the grant that purchased the weed harvester. Since that time, the left over monies have accumulated interest and grown to the current amount. These funds are earmarked for water quality projects.

The board voted to send \$1,800 to the Watershed Committee, as has been the practice, to assist with their work and to fund the septic tank pumping cost share project.


There was discussion of vandalism and thefts at Lake Carmi this spring. Several cottages along the north shore areas had their copper pipes stolen right from under the camps. Aluminum docks were also stolen. With the price of scrap copper and aluminum these products became attractive to thieves. Camp owners should be careful about securing their camps, come fall, to prevent easy access under the camps.

After discussion, the board voted, to not have a cottage tour in 2009. It was felt that perhaps it would be better to give it a year off.

President Lang presented the idea of doing a Lake Carmi Cookbook in 2009. This could be a multi-year project to raise funds, promote the lake and raise awareness of our "One Happy Lake."

A committee is being formed to carry out this project, working with a commercial cookbook publisher. Joe's Pond in Danville, and others have had very successful cookbook projects. It can be a great fund raiser too. Persons interesting in serving on a committee for this project should contact Newsletter Editor Larry Myott. Several members have already volunteered to serve, many hands will be needed. Contact Larry.Myott@uvm.edu, or telephone 802.285.6718.

The next meeting of the board of directors will be held on August 9 at 9:00 a.m. at the Dever Cottage on Patton Shore Road. All are welcome to attend.

Cutting Ice on Lake Carmi

.....Memories from Buzz Carman, Shore Road

We now watch to see when the ice will go out. Back in the early days of tourist cottages at Lake Carmi, they watched to see when they could cut the ice for storage. This storage was to supply the camp ice boxes during the summer. The above file photo shows the lake harvest in the early 1900's.

Before refrigeration at Lake Carmi, ice was harvested in the winter and stored in the Ice House at the Donald King Farm (now the Rainville Farm, across from Kings Court). As you read this in the summer heat of July, think of the times of below zero weather out on the lake to put up the ice for the summer people.

Harvesting ice was extremely labor intensive requiring teams of horses, and several men for weeks on end. Of course the weather conditions had to be right. The colder the weather and steadier the freezing, the cleaner and harder the ice was. One thaw at the wrong time could ruin the ice crop for the season.

First the snow had to be removed from the area to be harvested so that the ice would freeze clear and clean. Harvested blocks were about 2 X 3 feet in size and as thick as the ice was. Grids were laid out on the ice and an ice saw (see photo above) was used to cut them. The saw was nearly 5 feet long with large teeth. The men with the forks separated the blocks and kept them from refreezing. Getting the first block out was the most difficult as they weighed about 200 lbs. each. Once the block was floating free, they would use large tongs to grab the block and pull it from the water.

From there the blocks were taken to the ice house, and stored in several layers of sawdust for insulation, until it was needed in the warm summer. Much of the sawdust used at the King Ice House came from the sawmill on the Mill Pond.


As the campers arrived at Lake Carmi and needed ice to keep things cold, they placed a card in the cottage window telling Mr. King they needed ice and how much.



The ice man would weigh the block of ice and bring it into the cottage, placing it in the ice box. The ice box consisted of a large insulated wooden cabinet about 4 feet tall with two or more doors on the front. Usually the smaller door on the top front was where the ice was placed. Behind the larger

door was the “refrigerator” part of the ice box to keep food cool and safe. A block of ice might last for 3 or more days. The melting ice produced water that went into a pan below through a hose. Some folks drilled a hole through the floor so the water ran under the cottage.

Fun Facts About Loons

--The bones of most birds are hollow and light, but loons have solid bones. That is why they sit so low in the water, they are heavier than ducks and other water birds.

--The extra weight also helps them dive, as deep as 250 feet, to search for food. They can stay underwater for up to five minutes.

--Because their bodies are heavy relative to their wing size, loons need up to a 600 foot runway in order to take off from a lake.

--Loons can fly at up to 75 miles per hour.

--Scientists think loons live for 30 or more years.
